This year the Dorothy Ley Hospice celebrates 30 years of providing hospice palliative care for our community. It is also the 10th anniversary for our residence. In February 2009, the Hospice opened its new palliative care Centre and began offering residential care. In addition, Spiritual Care and Bereavement Care which had been a joint program became two distinct programs and an Integrative Wellness program was introduced. Today we provide a comprehensive suite of hospice palliative care services in the community and our residence that focuses on supporting the physical, spiritual and emotional needs of individuals with life limiting illness and their families.

Demand for our services continues to grow as a result of our aging society, heightened profile of the Hospice in the community and strengthened partnerships with other healthcare partners.

Together, this past year, we made a difference to our community in so many ways as we:

- Touched the lives of over 2,000 individuals and their families in the community.
- Served 208 individuals in our residence and supported them with quality end of life care.
- Supported 576 individuals with life limiting illness in the community.
- Provided bereavement, spiritual care and caregiver support to over 1,080 caregivers, bereaved family members and friends.
- Provided 24,172 hours of service by our 250 dedicated volunteers in the residence and the community. This year, with the support of increased funding from the LHIN, we trained more volunteers to support clients and their families in the community.
- Our generous community helped us raise over \$1 millon to support hospice programs, and over \$740,000 in support of our *Building on a Dream Campaign* to support the upkeep of our beautiful facility, and for new programs.

There is an old adage that says it takes a village to raise a child, care for the sick, the elderly, and those at the end of life. Here at the Dorothy Ley Hospice we have a wonderful village of care that includes our 250 volunteers, staff, donors, community physicians, community partners and supporters, and together we are making a difference in the lives of people with life limiting illness and their families. The exceptional care and support we at the Dorothy Ley Hospice are able to provide to individuals and their families during one of the most difficult times in their lives would not be possible without this village of care.

This past year we said good-bye to some staff, and welcomed many new staff, including our new Executive Director. Our focus last year and continuing this year is to strengthen our community programs and ensure we are meeting the needs of our community. This year we will: a) continue to strengthen and expand our community programs so more people can access support, and b) focus on measuring the experiences of all those we serve, and their families, so we can continue to improve our services. At the health system level, we are actively monitoring and building capacity to support the government's focus on health system transformation. In a word, we are excited about our continued work together to make even a greater difference to individuals, families and our community.

A caregiver recently shared her experience with our programs and stated, "Although heartbreaking, I couldn't have asked for a better experience. The staff and volunteers were so helpful and helped make my burden easier." This is a wonderful expression of the difference we make here at the Dorothy Ley Hospice. We are profoundly grateful to you – our village of care – for your heartfelt support. We offer our sincere Thank You for all that you do for the Dorothy Ley Hospice. Together, we are making a difference in our community and in the lives of the individuals, families and caregivers we serve.

The Mines did not know much about the Dorothy Ley Hospice beforehand, and they were surprised to learn that the Hospice must raise over \$1 Million annually in order to keep providing the services and programs to individuals and families facing a life-limiting illness. BUILDING ON THE DREAM CAMPAIGN





It is hard to believe that it is almost a year ago (September 6, 2018) that the Building on the Dream Campaign was officially launched at a special event held at St. George's Golf and Country Club.

We are delighted to report that our Building on the Dream campaign has raised \$740,000 in donations and pledges so far. Your support for this campaign will help the Hospice enhance its services, offer more educational seminars for families and caregivers, ensure funds are available for building repairs and equipment replacement, and create a fund to enable us to ride out swings in fundraising efforts.

One of the goals of the campaign was to eliminate the \$1.3 million mortgage on the Hospice Centre, enabling those funds to be redirected towards enhancing services for the people the Hospice serves. Thanks to your support, we were able to reduce the mortgage to \$900,000 when the mortgage came up for renewal in November. In addition, the bank has agreed to allow the hospice to make further principal payments with no penalty.

We cannot thank you enough for helping us achieve this first step in our ambitious goal.

Thanks to you and your support, we are looking at possible program enhancements. Right now, we are at the early research stages and looking at addressing needs in the community such as adding a second day to our Day Program and increasing the number of people receiving care in the community. With people living longer and baby boomers hitting their senior years, the demand for these services will continue to grow in the coming years. We need to put services in place now, to meet the expanding demand.

We still have a ways to go to reach our \$4 million target. If you have not yet given, please consider making a one-time gift or a multi-year gift.


